ASL - Age sex location

BF / GF - Boyfriend / Girlfriend

CD9 (Code 9) - My parents are around

F2F or **FTF** - Face to face

FWB - Friends with benefits

FYEO - For your eyes only

GNOC - Get naked on camera

LMIRL - Let's meet in real life

MorF - Male or female

MOS - Mum over shoulder

NIFOC - Naked in front of computer

OH - Overheard

PAW - Parents are watching

PIR - Parent in room

POS - Parent over shoulder

PRON - Porn

PRW - Parents are watching

QQ - Crying

S2R - Send to receive pictures

SWAK - Sealed with a kiss

SWYP - So, what's your problem?

TDTM - Talk dirty to me

Warez - Pirate software

WTPA - Where the party at?
