# Lateness - why being on time for school is important

There is a clear link between attendance and punctuality and academic achievement. Lateness impacts attendance and is as equally important as regular school attendance. Being on time means children won't miss out and fall behind with their learning and also provides opportunities for children to meet up with their friends and develop new relationships.

# Did you know how much learning children miss out on?

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equal days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days
