Holidays taken during term time

As part of our attendance strategy, we feel it is important to communicate the current position with respect to holidays that are taken during term time at Ashbrook Junior School.

The following is an extract from guidance supplied by the Department of Education to all schools in the United Kingdom:

'In 2013, the Department for Education (DFE) announced important amendments to legislation surrounding the taking of holidays in term time. With effect from 1 September 2013, The Education (Pupil Registration) Regulations 2006 state that a leave of absence during term time can only be approved by a school when a written request is made in advance of the leave being taken and the circumstances of the requested leave are 'exceptional'.

'Exceptional circumstances' are considered rare, significant, unavoidable and short, and any resulting absence from school could not reasonably be scheduled at another time.

Exceptional leave is NOT:

- · Availability of cheap flights and/or holidays
- · Availability of desired accommodation
- · Parent/carer work commitments
- · Poor weather experienced during school holiday periods
- · Overlap with the beginning or end of term, half term.

Parents/carers should also be aware that they maybe fined by the Local Authority for unauthorised absences.'

We would urge all parents considering taking time out of school during term time to talk to us directly and ensure that they have submitted a Leave of Absence Request Form.
