Priority 1- Quality of Education (Curriculum): To develop a curriculum that is coherently planned and sequenced towards cumulatively sufficient knowledge and skills; Teaching is designed to help learners to know and remember more and to integrate new knowledge into larger concepts.

Priority 2- Quality of Education (English): To develop a rigorous approach to the teaching of reading that develops confidence and a culture of reading for pleasure. To develop our children's oracy skills.

<u>Priority 3- Leadership and Management</u>: To ensure our leaders at all levels are focused on improving their own and staff's subject, pedagogical and pedagogical content knowledge to enhance the teaching of the curriculum. Leaders at all levels are able to articulate the rationale for their subject planning and sequencing.

Priority 4- Personal Development: To ensure that PD opportunities are coherently mapped out at the beginning of the academic year and monitor pupil participation, and target children who are not engaging.

At the end of each half term I will keep you updated on the activities / outcomes that we have achieved towards these.
