<u>Priority 3- Leadership and Management</u>: To ensure our leaders at all levels are focused on improving their own and staffs subject, pedagogical and pedagogical content knowledge to enhance the teaching of the curriculum. Leaders at all levels are able to articulate the rationale for their subject planning and sequencing.

<u>Priority 4- Personal Development:</u> To ensure that PD opportunities are coherently mapped out at the beginning of the academic year and monitor pupil participation, and target children who are not engaging.

At the end of each half term I will keep you updated on the activities / outcomes that we have achieved towards these.

"Insecure disused buildings pose a serious risk to anyone who enters them. Sites such as this are often in serios states of disrepair and have a number of potential dangers within them. Those entering these types of site are leaving themselves vulnerable to serious injury and even death. They are not playgrounds and should not be treated as such".

"If you are concerned about the security of a building then you should make the relevant local authority aware. If, however, there is an ongoing situation that is an emergency then you should contact the police on 999.


School Garden.

Dear Parents/Carers

Teacher Strikes

As you will be aware from our previous letters, teaching members of the National Education Union (NEU) have declared strike action. There have been strikes on the 1 February, 1, 15 and 16 March 2023. There are further strikes planned for Thursday 27 April and Tuesday 2 May 2023. The strike is happening as a result of a national dispute between the union and the government over pay and funding and not because of any issues at our school or with Transform Trust.

The NEU state that they are campaigning because teachers have lost 23% in real terms against inflation since 2010 and many teachers are leaving the profession as a result. One in eight teachers leave the profession after just a year in the classroom and one in three within five years. This, in turn, reduces the number of experienced teachers in the profession.

At Ashbrook Junior School, we do have some members of staff in the NEU so there will be disruption to school on Thursday 27 April and Tuesday 2 May 2023.

I can confirm that Jupiter Class and Mars Class will be closed on Thursday 27 April 2023.

On Tuesday 2 May 2023 the following classes will be closed Jupiter Class all day. Neptune Class will be closed AM only. Venus Class will be closed PM only. Where a class is only closed for half a day, pupils for that class should attend the remaining part of the day. Neptune pupils to come to school by 1.00pm and Venus pupils to be collected by 12.00noon.

Once again, we cannot confirm the scale of the disruption during those two days. This is because teachers can change their union before the strike dates and then participate in action.

As stated the decision to strike is not one that anyone takes lightly and please be assured when I tell you that teaching staff in our country are more concerned about the future and education service as a whole and the under-funding that occurs within it than themselves.

We will be in touch with parents of any children in Jupiter, Mars, Neptune and Venus Classes who are in receipt of Free School Meals directly.

We recognize and respect the right of our staff to take part in industrial action and ask that all members of our community continue to treat each other with respect. I understand that this situation may be frustrating and apologise for any potential disruption caused.
