The ancient Egyptian civilisation began 5,000 years ago when people started building villages next to the River Nile in northeast Africa.


The River Nile was an important source of water in a hot and dry desert landscape.

The ancient Egyptians became experts at building boats and navigating the river because the River Nile was used as a means of transporting materials for building projects.
