

## Key Knowledge

Borrowash is a village located in the county of Derbyshire.

Derbyshire is in the East Midlands region.

## Timeline of Key Events

1607 - Sir John Gell (Governor 1607 - Elvaston Castle was of Derby) ransacked the house acquired by the Stanhope for arms as the family supported family

1730 - Willian Stanhope was the first Baron

1939 - The Stanhope family and 11th Earl finally left the estate at the onset of the war

1970 – The park was officially designated a country park and opened to the public.

Vocabulary Census - An official count or survey, especially of a population

Grid reference - A map reference indicating a location in terms of a series of vertical and horizontal grid lines identified by letters or numbers

Human geography - The branch of geography dealing with how human activity affects or is influenced by the Earth's surface

Land use - The management and modification of natural environment or wilderness into a built environment such as settlements

Location - A particular place or position

Population - All the inhabitants of a particular place

Settlement - A place, typically one which has previously been uninhabited, where people establish a community

Village - A group of houses and associated buildings, smaller than a town and located in a rural area
