


Extreme Earth

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Volcano	
Tsunami	A long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance
Tornado	A mobile, destructive vortex of rotating winds that have the appearance of a funnel-shaped cloud
Crust	The layer of Earth we live on. It is a thin skin of rock around the Earth.
Mantle	Forms about half of the Earth and is made of heavier rock.
Core	The hot, dense centre of our planet
Tectonic	Relating to the structure of the Earth's crust and the large-scale processes which take place within it
Aftershock	A smaller earthquake following the main shock of a large earthquake
Epicentre	The point on the Earth's surface vertically above the focus of the earthquake
Cyclone	Another term for a tropical storm





Types of Climatic Hazard






Earthquakes

Are sudden violent shaking of the ground as a result of movements within the Earth's crust or volcanic action.




Volcanoes

A mountain or hill that has a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapour and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust




The Earth's Plates

Each of the several rigid pieces of the Earth's lithosphere which together make up the Earth's surface.




Tsunamis
