Attendance Update – week commencing 15 January 2024

Focus this week: Punctuality and Lateness

A huge congratulations again to our Year 6 children in Said for another weekly attendance of 100% attendance – well done.

Unfortunately, this week we are reporting that our whole school attendance has fallen to 95% which is below our target of 96%.

Lots of factors can impact attendance levels for example illness, holidays, medical appointments etc but did you know that **lateness also counts as absence**?

This academic year we have over **100** instances of children arriving late to start the school day. When we add all the minutes the school and children have lost due to lateness this equates to over **1,200** minutes of lost learning!

We understand that sometimes lateness cannot be avoided. However, when a child arrives late on a regular basis this can start to have a detrimental effect to that child and their learning and can also be disruptive to other pupils in their class.

The first part of our morning routine helps children;

- settle into school (e.g. hang their coats up, sort their school bags, order lunches etc),
- provides opportunities for children to catch up with friends,
- allows children time to talk to teachers if they need to; and
- sets out the timetable for the rest of the day.

If children miss out on this important part of the day, they can quickly begin to feel isolated and anxious and can start to fall behind in their learning.

What families can to do to help:

- Have a regular routine for the start of each day.
- Help all the child in your family get their clothes and equipment (e.g. shoes, packed lunches etc) ready before they go to bed.
- Set a reasonable bedtime to make sure everyone is getting enough sleep.
- If you are running late, contact the school office and let us know we may be able to help.

Remember our start times: all children should be in class by 8.55 am for registration.

What we can do to help

If you are experiencing difficulties getting to school on time on a regular basis, we would encourage you to talk to us, we are able to help and can support in many ways.
